## 1. Davidson Cotton Mill

Turn of century brick building built in 1890's is now home to Brickhouse Tavern & offices  
209 Delburg St.  
Davidson, NC 28036

## 2. Ada Jenkins School

Built in 1937, Davidson Colored School later called Ada Jenkins School is a rare & well preserved example of a substantial African-American school from that era  
212 Gamble St.  
Davidson, NC 28036

## 3. Downtown Davidson

Take in the historical charm of downtown with sites like the Helper Hotel built in 1848; Stop by Town Hall for Davidson Historical Society's walking map (self-guided)  
216 S. Main St. (Town Hall)

## 4. Davidson College

Buildings like Oak Row, Elm Row, & Eumenean Hall are part of the original Quadrangle, built in 1837  
405 N. Main St.

## 5. Ghost Walk of Davidson

Historic haunts of Davidson come to life on this guided tour; call for reservations

## 6. Unity Church Cabin/Lingle Hut

Built in 1932, the cabin is the first communal-built rustic-revival log building in Mecklenburg County

## 7. Cornelius Veteran's Monument

Monument features the name of every veteran ever to reside in Cornelius. (Next to Town Hall)  
Corner of Catawba Ave. & Main St.,  
Cornelius, NC 28031

## 8. Cornelius Heritage Hall

Located in Town Hall, exhibit gives a tangible overview of the Town's history

## 9. Union Bethel AME Zion Church

African-American church built in 1927  
20736 Catawba Ave.  
Cornelius, NC 28031

## 10. Mount Zion United Methodist Church

Established in 1827, built in 1835, the church is older than the Town of Cornelius; 47 Civil War soldiers are buried in the cemetery  
19600 Zion Ave.

## 11. Beaver Dam House

Built in 1829 by Major William Lee Davidson, the Federal style home now serves as a meeting, group, & wedding venue  
19600 Davidson-Concord Rd.  
Davidson, NC 28036

## 12. Ramah Presbyterian Church

Built in 1801 in Greek Revival style. Historic cemetery located across from church  
14401 Ramah Church Rd.  
Huntersville, NC 28078

## 13. The Bradford Store

100 year old store with on-site blacksmith  
15915 Davidson Concord Rd. (Hwy. 73)  
Huntersville, NC 28078

## 14. Ephraim Alexander McAuley House

Two-story log house, built in 1880, is currently awaiting restoration by the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Historic Landmarks Commission  
14335 Huntersville-Concord Rd.

## 15. Torrence-Lytle School

Built in 1937, the school represented the first opportunity for African-Americans to attend public high-school in the region

## 16. Alexandria

Site of the signing of the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence May 20, 1775  
9921 Old Statesville Rd. (Hwy. 115)

## 17. The Ranson House

Built in 1913, the Colonial Revival style home now serves as a meeting, group, & wedding reception venue  
412 S. Old Statesville Rd. (Hwy. 115)  
Huntersville, NC 28078

## 18. St. Marks Episcopal Church

Built in 1886 by local craftsmen in the English Country Gothic Style with burial grounds  
8600 Mount Holly-Huntersville Rd.  
Huntersville, NC 28078

## 19. Hugh Torance House & Store

Built in 1779 by Hugh Torance, is currently the oldest standing store in North Carolina

## 20. Hopewell Presbyterian Church

Built in 1762, much of the original structure remains; The cemetery reads like a who is who list in Mecklenburg history, including James Latta, Hugh Torance, & famed Revolutionary War General William Lee Davidson

## 21. Historic Latta Plantation

Circa 1800 cotton plantation built by James Latta, the Early Federal style house & living farm offer guided tours, annual reenactments, events, & festivals

## 22. Historic Rural Hill

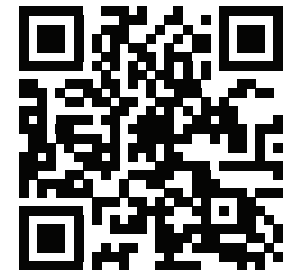
Built in 1788, the original homestead was the post Revolutionary War home of Major John Davidson. The site offers multiple historic structures including an early African-American school, plus annual events & festivals
